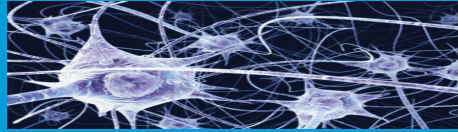

- 1) **Summer Undergraduate Research Experience (SURE):** Applications are now open (Feb. 28 deadline) for undergraduates from all majors and from many demographics. SURE is a paid undergraduate research experience for students interested in GRADUATE SCHOOL and research/creative work within their discipline or a related discipline. 2018 SURE program dates are May 29-July 27, 2018. 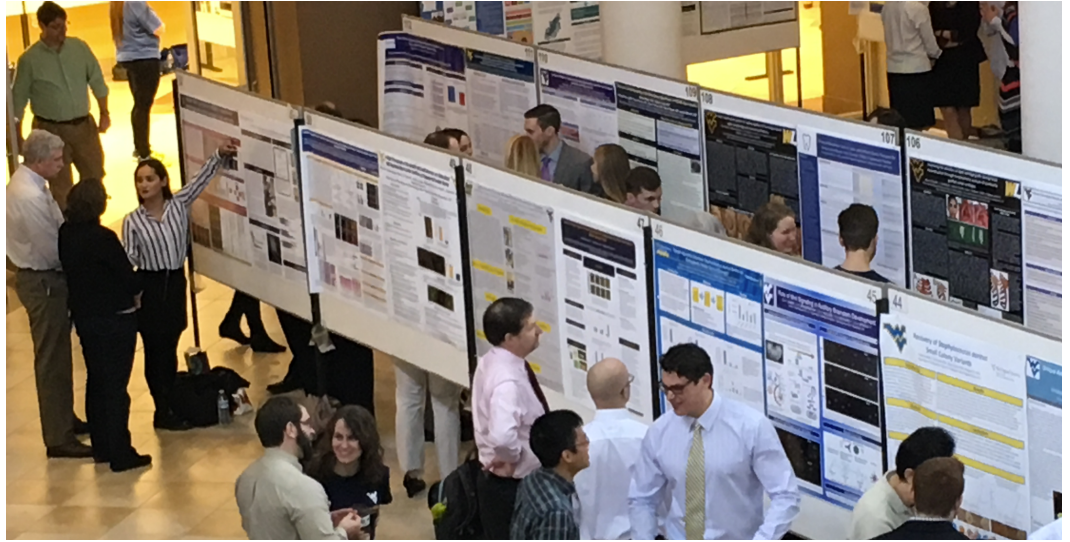
